#### ECOLOGY AND MANAGEMENT OF INVASIVE RIPARIAN AND AQUATIC PLANTS

#### PROPOSED OUTLINE FOR THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MEETING

It is proposed to publish a volume of papers from the meeting through either J. Wiley or Packard Publishing. The volume would be edited by John Brock, Louise de Waal and Max Wade with independent referees being used in addition.

The timetable for the production of the volume would be as follows:

End of May	Deadline for submission of papers to Louise at ICOLE
June-July	Refereeing and editing of papers
End of July	Deadline for return of papers to authors
End of August	Return amended papers to Louise at ICOLE
Early October	Final copy to publisher

Papers should be submitted in a standard form suitable for scientific/biological journals. If necessary they will be retyped in a uniform format by ICOLE. If you are able to submit your material on disc this would be preferable. Acceptable forms are: Apple Macintosh - Word, MacWrite or text (ASCII); or IBM MS-DOS (three inch disc). We should be able to translate across from most well known word processor packages, e.g. WordStar, WordPerfect. If in doubt send us your disc and we can try to translate it across. (Remember to keep a copy !) Please note that we cannot convert conventional Amstrad discs only PC compatible ones.
